<p style="text-align: center;"><b>YEAR 1 Semester 1</b> Mobility Arrangements Step 1</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>ERASMUS+ MOBILITY APPLICATION</b></p> <p>The mobility semester is financed by Erasmus+ Exchange Programme. All EJMPEAS students are required to apply for the Erasmus+ places at partner universities as specified in the nomination letter they received on provisional selection by the Consortium. <p style="text-align: center;"><b>YEAR 1 Semester 2</b> Mobility Arrangements Step 2</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>ERASMUS+ MOBILITY CHECKLIST</b></p> <p>Before starting the mobility semester, students are required to familiarise themselves with the checklist of necessary arrangements to ensure that their applications for mobility are complete. The learning agreement must be consulted and signed by EJMPEAS Co-ordinator. <p style="text-align: center;"><b>YEAR 2 Semester 1</b> Diploma Project Completion Step 1</p>	<p>During their mobility semester, all EJMPEAS students are obliged to stay in contact with their diploma project supervisors and actively work on their theses.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>YEAR 2 Semester 2</b> Diploma Project Completion Step 2</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>2<sup>nd</sup> READER CALL: 30 April</b></p> <p>All EJMPEAS diploma projects are reviewed by scholars from partner universities. By 30 April, all EJMPEAS students are required to submit a 200-word abstract of their prospective dissertation to EJMPEAS co-ordinator so that a call for the Second Reader for their dissertation can be announced at partner universities.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>YEAR 2 Semester 2</b> Diploma Project Completion Step 3</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>DISSERTATION SUBMISSION: 15 JUNE</b></p> <p>All EJMPEAS students who wish to defend their dissertation in July (and thereby complete their studies) are required to submit the final version of their dissertation, accepted by their supervisors by 15 June into the AP system (the repository of diploma projects).</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>YEAR 2 Semester 2</b> Diploma Project Completion Step 4</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>MA VIVA</b></p> <p>The Viva (defence of the MA dissertation) is the crowning event of the course. Students are admitted to sit the examination on completion of the programme and provided that their dissertation has received favourable reviews from the supervisor and 2<sup>nd</sup> reader. The exact date of the MA Viva is arranged by the supervisor, but the usual time is the second week of July.</p>
